Friday Sept 3rd

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Westward and cloudy weather At 3 p m spoke Bark Lerah B. Teal Capt. Mocum 90 barrels Through the night light breeze and calm Latter part under of all sails saw three sails so ends

Lat 36°02 Long 35°38

Saturday Sept 4th

This twenty four hours commences with calm weather At sun down short in sails through the night the same At day light set the sails had light breeze saw several sails so ends

Lat 36°04 Long 35°52

Sunday Sept 5th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze and good weather At 4 p m spoke Bark Ware she saw school of whales day before she strike one iron come out Through the night calm Latter part under of all sails had light breeze from Westward so ends

Lat 36°03 Long 36°06

Monday Sept 6th

This day commences with fine breeze from S W and passing clouds headed W N W at sun down short in sails Through the night wind hauled N W headed N by E Latter part headed N N E set all the sails hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 36°58 Long 36°40

Tuesday Sept 7th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from N W and good weather headed N N E At 1 p m tack ship headed W N W At sun down short in sails Through the night calm Latter part light breeze hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 36°16 Long 37°05

Wednesday Sept 8th

This day commences with light winds and passing clouds At 8 p m spoke Bark E B Phillips of Boston 14 months out 75 barrels Through the night and Latter part calm so ends

Lat 36°11 Long 36°58

Thursday Sept 9th

All this twenty four hours light breeze and calm headed to N E still cruising saw two sails so ends

Lat 37°10 Long 36°00
