

Remarks on board of Brig

Friday Sept 10th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Southward and good weather headed to the Eastward At sun down furled the light sails through the night the same latter part set the sails and stored Eby's mate sick so ends

Lat 37°19 Long 34°35

Saturday Sept 11th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from S W and fair weather steered E by N Middle part the same latter steered E & S At 8 A m saw vessel ahead with out mast steered for her hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 37°55 Long 33°25

Sunday Sept 12

This day commences with fine breeze from Westward and good weather At noon Capt Brounell went on board of the reck At 1 1/2 p m boat returned steered N N E Middle and latter part calm and light air saw one sail so ends

Lat 35°25 Long 32°56

Monday Sept 13th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from S W and calm At 3 p m saw a sail stem Middle and latter part the same At 8 A m spoke Bark Teine of New Bedford Capt White 2 months out 130 barrels so ends

Tuesday Sept 14th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze and good weather steered N E Through the night and latter part strong breeze from Northward At 6 1/2 A m saw Island of Flores At noon land bears E Dist 12 miles so ends. Chronometer out of Way 50 miles

Wednesday Sept 15th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from N E and fair weather headed E by S 1/2 S through the night light breeze At midnight back ship headed for Flores latter part good weather At 5 A m Capt went on shore at 11 he returned got 10 bushels of potatoes 2000 of onions and 35 dozens of eggs so ends
