

Remarks on board of Brig

Thursday Sept 23rd
This twenty four hours commences with fresh gale from W.N.W. and squally weather. Steered S.E. employed in washing the vessel inside. Through the night strong breeze. At 4 A.M. saw St. Miguel At 8 A.M. came to anchor. Furl'd the sails and took tugboat and went farther in. In the afternoon washed the vessel out side so ends this day with 36 hours to begin the harbour log.

Friday Sept 24th
At 6 A.M. commence to break out oil and pump the salt water of the casks on the ground tier. Through the day got the oil up on deck and cooper it so ends.

Saturday Sept 25th
Commence with good weather employed in breaking out the after hole in afternoon painted the vessel bend in port side. At 3 P.M. a lighter came long side from shore with provision took it on deck and stowed some below so ends.

Sunday Sept 26th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze and good weather let all hands went on shore so ends.

Monday Sept 27th
Commence with fine breeze and fair weather employed in stow the main hatches and the after hole and black vermish the iron works and got the casks ready for get water wash the vessel so ends.

Tuesday Sept 28th
Commence with light winds from eastward and fine weather employed in getting water and pump the salt water out and fill the fresh water so ends.

Wednesday Sept 29th
Commence with fine weather through the day finish getting the water 240 Tls and stowed the hole and stowed the provision and sails wash the vessel so ends.

Thursday Sept 30th
This twenty four hours commence with fine weather employed in stowering the after hole and served the main stay so ship duty so ends.

Friday October 1st
This day commence with light breeze and fine weather Starboard watch went shore on liberty the other watch employed in repairing the fore sail received 3 cords of wood from shore so ends.
