

Remarks on board of Brig

Friday Nov 19th
All this twenty four hours fine S E
trades and fine weather Steered S W by W
Under all sails saw a sail bound
to S E hands employed in ship duty
so ends

Lat 10° 44' S Long 27° 45'

Saturday Nov 20th
First part this twenty four hours light
S E trades and fine weather steered S W by W
Middle and latter part fine breeze
saw three sails hands employed in ship
duty so ends.

Lat 12° 36' S Long 29° 32'

Sunday Nov 21st
All this twenty four hours fine S E trades
and good weather steered S W by W
saw one sail bound to Southward
so ends

Lat 13° 39' S Long 30° 35'

Monday Nov 22nd
All this twenty four hours fine breeze
from E S E and good weather steered W
S W hands employed in ship duty
so ends.

Lat 14° 50' Long 31° 57'

Tuesday Nov 23
All this twenty four hours fine breeze
from E S E and fair weather steered W
S W employed in breaking out provision
saw one sail so ends

Lat 15° 23' S Long 31° 35'

Wednesday Nov 24th
First part this twenty four hours commencing
with strong breeze from E S E and
passing clouds Steered W S W At sun
down short in sails huf to headed to
the Northward Through the night wind E S E
At day light set the sails and steered
W hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat 16° 43' Long 34° 52'

Thursday Nov 25th
This day commences with fine breeze
from E S E and passing clouds steered
W S W At sun down short in sails
huf to headed N by E Through the night
the same at day light set the sails and
steered N W employed in repairing the
middle stay sail so ends

Lat 16° 26' Long 36° 35'

Friday Nov 26th
This day commences with light breeze from
Eastward and passing clouds steered S W by W
At 5 p m saw two whalers to the S W
sun down short in sails huf to headed S E
Through the night the same at day light
set the sails still cruising so ends.
