

Remarks on board of Brig

Wednesday Jan 5th

This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from Northward and fine weather headed to N E At 6 1/2 p m wore ship and short in sails headed S Through the night the same Latter part light breeze steered S W employed in ship duty so ends.

Thursday Jan 6th

This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from Northward and fair weather steered S S W At sun down short in sails huf to Through the night the same Latter part fresh breeze steered W S W so ends

Lat 25° 02 Long 36° 30

Friday Jan 7th

This twenty four hours commence with fresh breeze from Northward and passing clouds steered S At sun down short in sails and huf to headed W N W Through the night the same At day light fine breeze set the sails steered W S W hands employed in repairing the main sail so ends

Lat 25° 37 Long 36° 03

Saturday Jan 8th

This day commences with fine breeze from Northward and good weather steered S E sun down short in sail huf to headed to the Westward Latter part light breeze Latter part calm employed in breaking out provision so ends

Lat 25° 57 Long 35° 30

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Sunday Jan 9th

This day commence with calm weather At 3 1/2 p m got light breeze from Southward Through the night strong breeze and squally Latter part more moderate steered N W so ends

Lat 26° 34 Long 36° 12

Monday Jan 10th

This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from E N E and fair weather steered N N W At sun down short in sails and headed to the Northward Through the night the same Latter part set the sails headed N W 1/2 N so ends

Lat 25° 55 Long 37° 04

Tuesday Jan 11th

This day commences with strong breeze from N N E and passing clouds headed N W by N At sun down short in sails tack ship headed to the Eastward Through the night the same Latter part better weather saw a whaler to the westward so ends

Lat 25° 44 Long 36° 50

Wednesday Jan 12th

This day commence with fine breeze from Northward and fair weather headed to the Eastward At 3 1/2 p m spoke Bark Laraki B Hale she saw whales 5 times since this season got nothing Through the night wind hauled to the Eastward tack ship headed N N W Latter part fine breeze headed N W by W so ends
