Friday Jan 28th

This day commence with moderate winds from Southward and rainy weather steered N. Through the night fine breeze All day light keep her off NNE employed in stowing down the rest of the oil 18 bbls so ends

Lat 27°20 Long 39°30

Saturday Jan 29th

This day commence with fine breeze from SE and fair weather steered N employed in stowing the oil and the hole. At sun down short in sail but he headed ENE. Through the night the same latter part light breezes and rain squalls hands employed in cleaning the vessel & wash her inside so ends no obs.

Sunday Jan 30th

This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from Eastward and rain squalls At 3 p m had squall from SE headed E by N 1/2 N Through the night the same latter part light breeze steered NNE so ends.

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Monday Jan 31st

This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from SE and fair weather headed E by N. At sun down short in sails Through the night the same latter part good weather employed in repairing the fore top sail At noon finish it saw two sails so ends

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Southward and fair weather headed ENE At 2 p m spoke Bark Hadley At sun down short in sails Through the night the same latter part employed in repairing the cutting gear so ends

Lat 24°47 Long 38°25

Wednesday Feb 2nd

This day commence with light breeze from SE and good weather headed to the Eastward employed in repairing the cutting gear At 6 p m were ship headed to the Southward and short in sails Through the night wind hauled to the Eastward latter part steered I saw two sails employed in repairing the cutting gear so ends
