Sunday Feb 27th

All this twenty four hours fine breeze from E to NE and passing clouds headed from NNE to SSW saw three sails so ends

Lat 19°14 Long 30°15

Monday Feb 28th

This day commences with fine breeze from NE and passing clouds headed NNE Middle and Latter part unwhauled & headed NNE hands employed in ship duty saw two sails so ends

Lat 16°51 Long 30°25

Tuesday Feb 29th

First and Middle part this twenty four hours fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather headed NE by E Latter part squally weather furlled the night sails so ends sailing.

Wednesday March 1st

This day commence with light breeze from Eastward and rain squalls headed to the Northward Through the night calm and light winds headed N by E & E Latter part fine breeze headed the same hands employed in ship duty so ends

Thursday March 2nd

This day commence with fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather headed NE by N Middle and Latter part headed NE hands employed in ship duty so ends.

This day commence with fine breeze from Eastward and passing clouds headed NE Through the night headed NE by N Latter part the same employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 9°30 Long 29°55

Saturday March 4th

This day commence with light breeze from Eastward and fine weather headed NE employed in repairing the main top stay sail At 5 p m finish it and bent it on saw two sails Through the night headed NE by E Latter part headed NE by E employed in repairing the fore sail so ends

Lat 8°00 Long 29°20

Sunday March 5th

This day commence with light breeze from Eastward and fair weather headed NE employed in repairing the fore sail At 5 p m finish it and bent it on Through the night wind ESE Latter part wind SE steered NE so ends
