Wednesday March 22nd

This day commence with fine trades and good weather headed N.W. by N. At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part light air and calm headed to the S.E. hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 13°35' Long 42°05'

Thursday March 23rd

This day commence with light air and calm headed to S.E. At sun down short in sails Middle and Latter part calm saw three sails employed in repairing the fore gallant sail so ends

Lat 13°28' Long 42°17'

Friday March 24th

This day commences with calm weather finish the fore gallant sail and bent it on & ship duty Middle part the same Latter part saw Blackfish lowered the boats L.B. got one At noon spoke Sch Luisa A of Boston 3 months out 80 bbls so ends

Lat 13°30' Long 42°48'

Saturday March 25th

All this twenty four hours light air and calm headed to S.E. employed in muzzing the blubber and repaired the L Boat saw 3 whalers so ends

Lat 13°07' Long 42°20'

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Sunday March 26th

All this twenty four hours light air and calm saw finbacks and saw one sail so ends

Lat 13°11' Long 42°18'

Monday March 27th

This day commence with light air and calm headed to E.N.E. Through the night and Latter part the same headed to the Blackfish blubber so ends

This day commence with light air and calm Middle part the same Latter part light breeze At 8 et m spoke Bark Hadley so ends

Lat 13°40' Long 41°30'

Wednesday March 29th

This day commence with light breeze from N.N.E. and fine weather headed to the Northward Through the night the same Latter part fine breeze headed N.N.E. saw three sails employed in breaking out in after hole and stowed the ground tier and filled with salt water so ends

Lat 14°17' Long 42°05'

Comencing at 12-00 and 4-00
