Thursday March 30th

This day commence with fine breeze from E N E and fair weather headed to the Northward employed in breaking out for provision Through the night and latter part strong breeze saw three sails hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 14°50 Long 42°27

Friday March 31st

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from E N E and passing clouds headed to S E saw two sails so ends

Lat 13°54 Long 41°52

Saturday April 1st

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from E N E and cloudy weather headed to S E hands employed in ship duty still cruising so ends

Lat 13°03 Long 41°22

Sunday April 2nd

First and Middle part this twenty four hours strong breeze from E N E and cloudy weather headed to S E Latter part more moderate At 5 1/2 A m wore ship headed to the Northward so ends

Lat 12°42 Long 41°10

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Monday April 3rd

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from E N E and passing clouds headed to the northward At sun down shot in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails employed in breaking out for water saw one sail to the northward so ends

Lat 14°05 Long 41°38

Tuesday April 4th

This day commence with fine breeze and fair weather under of all sails at sun down At 10 P m Ducker was three miles off she lowered three boats down At dark boats went on board Through the night under of sails At daylight back ship headed to the northward saw Bark to the windward so ends

Lat 15°04 Long 42°05

Wednesday April 5th

First part this day fine breeze from E N E and fair weather headed to S E Middle part the same Latter part strong breeze and cloudy so ends

Lat 14°05 Long 41°22

Thursday April 6th

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather headed to the southward Still cruising saw nothing so ends

Lat 13°30 Long 40°55

Cruising off 12°00 and 40°00
