First and middle part this twenty

headed to the northward Latter part
more moderate so ends

Saturday April 8th
This day commence with fine breeze
from Eastward and fair weather
headed to the northward through the
night the same At 4 p m wore ship
headed to S E employed in overhauling
the blocks and hauled the straps so ends

Sunday April 9th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze
and good weather headed to the South
ward still cruising saw nothing
so ends.

Monday April 10th
Commence with fine breeze from east
ward and fine weather steered S W by
S at sun down huf to and short in
sails headed to S E through the night
the same Latter part steered S saw
a sail to the Eastward huf to by the
wind employed in overhauling the
blocks & ship duty so ends

the blocks so ends

Wednesday April 12th
This day commence with fine breeze
from Eastward and fair weather steered
N W At sun down huf to headed N
N E through the night the same Latter
part steered N W hands employed in
take off leather and scorchman of rig-
ging and based under it and put
it back so ends

Thursday April 13th
This day commence with fine breeze from
Eastward and fair weather steered N W
At 4 p m huf to headed to the northward
through the night the same Latter part
strong breeze steered S W by S hands
employed in working on the rigging
so ends.

Friday April 14th
This day commence with fresh breeze from
Eastward steered S W by S At sun down
huf to headed S E Middle and Latter
the same hands employed in working
on the rigging so ends.

Cruising off 12-00 and 40-00
