Remarks on board of Brig

Sunday April 23rd
All this twenty four hours strong breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather still cruising saw two sails so ends
Lat 12 58 Long 41 58

Monday April 24th
This day commences with strong breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather still cruising spoke Brig D. A. Small of Provincetown 70 bbls since leaving St Michel and saw Bark Sparrow she got 420 bbls this season Through the night and latter part the same so ends
Lat 12 54 Long 42 00

Tuesday April 25th
This day commence with strong breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather through the night the same Latter part fine breeze still cruising employed in breaking out for provision and water & ship duty so ends
Lat 13 50 Long 42 20

Wednesday April 26th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather still cruising saw two sails hands employed in ship duty so ends
Lat 13 30 Long 41 56

Thursday April 27th
This day commences with fine breeze from N. E. and fair weather still cruising hands employed in ship duty Through the night and latter part weather the same employed in setting up the fore gallard rigging At 11 30 m saw whales going to the windward got the boats ready so ends
Lat 14 20 Long 42 45

Friday April 28th
This day commence with fine breeze and good weather lowered the two boats for whales L. B. got one W. B. got another At 4 12 p. m. boats got the whales long side at 5 p. m. commence to cut whales in At 9 p. m. finish cutting Through the night hands busily employed in working at the whales head Latter part started the fire and cut up the blubber so ends boiling.

Saturday April 29th
This day commence with fine breeze and good weather headed E. S. E. employed in boiling and & Through the night the same Latter part fine weather saw two whales At 10 1/2 m finish boiling clean up the deck so ends
Lat 13 20 Long 41 22
