Sunday April 30<sup>th</sup>

This day commence with fine breeze from ENE and fair weather Middle part the same Latter part strong breeze and cloudy still cruising so end

Lat Long

Monday May 1<sup>st</sup>

This day commence with strong breeze from Eastward and smoky weather Middle part the same Latter part fresh breeze employed in pumping out the salt water and stowed some of the oil on the ground tier 23 bbls saw one sail, still cruising so ends

Lat 13° 08 Long 40° 52

Tuesday May 2<sup>nd</sup>

This day commences with fresh breeze from Eastward and smoky weather At 1 1/2 p m spoke Bark Aspray 18 months out 800 bbls and spoke Bark Aberdeen 46 months out 1600 bbls Middle and Latter part strong breeze so ends

Lat 14° 15 Long 41° 40

Wednesday May 3<sup>rd</sup>

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather still cruising saw three sails so ends

Lat 13° 03 Long 41° 45

Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with strong breeze from Eastward and smoky weather headed to SE At 4 p m saw a white water of sea bow At 5 1/4 p m made it out sperm whales lowered the two larboard boats At 6 p m boats returned did not see them from the boats through the night headed to NNE Latter part wore ship headed SE by S with strong breeze under short sails so ends

Lat 13° 00 Long 41° 45

Friday May 5<sup>th</sup>

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from ENE and smoky weather headed SE by S under of short sails so ends

Lat 11° 55 Long 41° 14

Saturday May 6<sup>th</sup>

All this twenty four hours strong breeze from Eastward and smoky weather still cruising repaired the look out hoops & ship duty so ends

Lat 12° 59 Long 41° 48

Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup>

All this twenty four hours fresh breeze from Eastward and peaking clouds headed to the Northward so ends

Lat 14° 14 Long

Cruising off 12:00 and 4:00
