Remarks on board of Brig

Friday May 26th

This day commence with fine trades and fair weather steered W by N finish repairing the stay sail Middle and Latter part weather the same steered W so ends

Lat 13° 30 Long 57° 48

Saturday May 27th

All this twenty four hours fine breeze and passing clouds steered W employed in scraping the masts & ship duty and scrape the rails so ends

Lat 13° 33 Long 54° 14

Sunday May 28th

All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Eastward and good weather steered W by S so ends

Lat 13° 20 Long 55° 56

Monday May 29th

All this twenty four hours fine trades and smoky weather steered W by S employed in washing the vessel inside & ship duty so ends

Lat 13° 13 Long 58° 57

Tuesday May 30th

This day commence with fine trades and smoky weather steered W by S At 4 p m saw Island of Barbadoes At 5 1/2 p m got the cable up and bent it through the night fine weather At 9 a m came to anchor in 5 fathoms of water & employed in washing the vessel so ends this day with 36 hours to begin the harbour leg.

All this twenty four hours fine breeze and good weather employed in stowing the main hatchers get ready for water so ends

Thursday June 1st

All this day fine breeze and pleasant weather finish stowing the hold and employed in tarring down so ends

Friday June 2nd

All this day fine weather employed in tarring the rigging and uncent the sails and painted the yards so ends

Saturday June 3rd

All this day fine weather got from the water boats 140 bbls of water and 8 bbls of meat & of flour and stow it below and employed in painting the vessel out side and repaired the fore top sail so ends

Sunday June 4th

All this twenty four hours fine breeze and good weather send a shore one watch on liberty so ends

Monday June 5th

All this twenty four hours fine weather employed in painting the vessel At 6 a m watch came on board the other went shore so ends
