Saturday June 17th
This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather steered N by E Middle and latter part steered N by W hands employed in ship duty so ends

Sunday June 18th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Eastward and good weather steered N N W so ends
Lat 18°56 Long 61°15

Monday June 19th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze and fair weather steered N W hands employed in ship duty break out for provision and water so ends
Lat 20°56 Long 63°04

Tuesday June 20th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Eastward and good weather steered N W hands employed in ship duty so ends
Lat 22°45 Long 64°58

Wednesday June 21st
All this twenty four hours light breeze from E and cloudy weather steered N by N hands employed in ship duty so ends
Lat 24°17 Long 64°20

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Thursday June 22nd
All this twenty four hours light breeze from E and cloudy weather steered N W by N employed in repairing the main stay sail and middle stick it & so ends
Lat 25°11 Long 67°24

Friday June 23rd
First part this twenty four hours light breeze from Southward and cloudy weather steered N W by E through the night had some rain latter part cloudy hands employed in making spongecake so ends
Lat 25°00 Long 68°08

Saturday June 24th
All this twenty four hours light breeze from Southward and rain squalls steered N W by E hands employed in ship duty so ends
Lat 26°45 Long 68°58

Sunday June 25th
All this twenty four hours light breeze from Westward and passing clouds steered N W by E saw one sail steering N W so ends

Monday June 26th
All this twenty four hours light breeze from Westward and rain squalls steered N W hands employed in ship duty so ends
