Tuesday June 27th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Westward and fair weather still
N by W 2 W hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 29° 55 Long 74° 30

Wednesday June 28th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Westward and fair weather headed N by W hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 31° 28 Long 72° 05

Thursday June 29th
All this twenty four hours light breeze from Westward and fair weather still cruising hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 31° 47 Long 72° 20

Friday June 30th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Southward and good weather headed W hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 31° 46 Long 72° 58

Saturday July 1st
All this twenty four hours light breeze from Southward and fine weather headed W 1/2 N hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 32° 06 Long 74° 05

Sunday July 2nd
Commence with fine breeze and good weather headed W 1/2 N at 1 p m saw whales to the windward of the vessel At 3 p m lowered the two boats L boat and W boat At 6 1/2 p m boats returned got nothing through the night headed W 1/2 S in one track and S E on the other saw several merchant vessels so ends

Lat 32° 04 Long 74° 40

Monday July 3rd
This day commence with fine breeze from S S W and fine weather headed S S E through the night headed to the Westward Latter part weather the same At 8 A m saw whales lowered the boats L Boat got one At noon got the whale long side and got ready to cut the whale in so ends

Lat 31° 53 Long 74° 47

Tuesday July 4th
This day commence with light breeze and fine weather employed in cutting the whale in At 7 p m finish cutting through the night hands busily employed At midnight started the fire Latter part fine weather so ends boiling

Lat 31° 53 Long 75° 00

Wednesday July 5th
All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Southward and good weather still cruising employed in boiling &c so ends

Lat 31° 43 Long 74° 40
