Sunday Aug 6th
All this twenty four hours light
breeze from Southward and calm
steered N N W saw one sail steering
N W so ends

Lat 34° 01 Long

Monday Aug 7th
First and Middle part this twenty
four hours light breeze from S W steered
N N W Latter part fine breeze steered
N by W hands employed in ship duty
so ends

Lat Long

Tuesday Aug 8th
This day commence with fine breeze
from S W and good weather spoke
Gen Jesse Hart 2nd found the Chronometer
out of the way 60 miles we steered N N E
Middle and Latter part the same hands
employed in ship duty saw several sails
so ends

Lat 37° 08 Long 74° 30

Wednesday Aug 9th
First and Middle part this twenty
four hours light breeze from N N W
and fair weather steered N E by N 1/2 N
Latter part wind hauled to the east
ward tack ship headed N N E hands
employed in ship duty saw several
sails so ends

Lat 37° 53 Long 73° 55

Thursday Aug 10th
All this twenty four hours light breeze
from Eastward and good weather
headed N N E hands employed in ship
duty took all the gear out of the boats
and stow it below saw several sails
so ends. At noon sounded and found
27 fathoms.

Lat 38° 55 Long 73° 49

Friday Aug 11th
All this twenty four hours light
breeze from Eastward and calm headed
N N E hands employed in scraping the
masts & ship duty saw several sails
sounded and found 18 fathoms. so
ends

Lat 39° 47 Long 73° 37
