

Remarks on board of Brig

E H Adams Capt Brounell 1876

Saturday Aug 12th
This day commence with light breeze from Eastward and fine weather headed N N E at 6 p m wind hauled to S E steered E N E Through the night and latter part the same At 6 A m saw Long Island and saw several sails so ends

Lat 40°26 Long 72°45

Sunday Aug 13th
This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from S E and good weather Steered S E N E Long Island in sight Middle and latter part the same saw several sails so ends

Monday Aug 14th
This twenty four hours commence with light air from S E and calm headed E by N At 8 m I E point of Bl Island bears E N E Dist 8 miles Through the night calm and foggy At 10 a m got breeze from E N E so ends

Tuesday Aug 15th
This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from Eastward and dark complexion weather headed S E in one tack and N by E on the other Through the night wind increase and blow hard Latter part wind hauled W headed to the Northward under of all sails so ends

Wednesday Aug 16th
This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from Westward and good weather Steered N by E At 4 1/2 p m pilot came on board and steered for New Bedford At 8 p m got long side the wharf so ends this voyage
