

Remarks on board of

Wednesday Aug 20th 1884

Lat 31.42.50. Fore and middle parts of this day light
 Long 52.11 W. Light breeze from the eastward. Brig on the
 southern tack by the wind. Employed in
 various ways. Latter part moderate easterly wind
 And so ends the day

Thursday Aug 21st 1884

Lat 30.33.50 Fore part of this day moderate breeze from the
 Long 51.20 W. E. N. E. by the wind on the southern tack
 Two sails in sight. Middle part the same
 Broke out flow + 3. read. Latter part
 moderate easterly wind Ship on the southern
 tack.

Friday Aug 22nd 1884

Lat 30.03.50 Fore part of this day moderate breeze from
 Long 50.22 W. the E. N. E. Middle part the Brig increased
 to a fresh breeze. Two sails in sight steering
 to the southward. Employed in various ways.
 Latter part moderate breeze from the eastward
 Brig on the Northern tack.

Saturday Aug 23rd 1884

Lat 29.04.00 Fore part of this day moderate breeze from
 the eastward running to the S. S. Ship
 on both tacks. Middle part squally with
 the wind baffling from S. E. to S. W. with
 cloudy rainy weather. Latter part moderate
 easterly wind Brig on the Northern tack
 And so ends the day

Sunday Aug 24th 1884

Lat 28.42.50 Fore and middle parts of this day light
 Long 48.45 W. Easterly wind with fine clear weather
 Brig on the Northern tack heading N. E.
 Nothing in sight to day. Latter part moderate
 breeze from the E. S. E. 3. is on the northern
 tack. Put one sail at 1.30. A. M. Saw and
 she was a whaler.

Monday Aug 25th 1884

Lat 32.40.50 Fore and middle parts of this day light
 Long 48.00 W. wind with an occasional squall from the
 E. S. E. Ship by the wind on the starboard
 tack. Broke out coal and employed in various
 other ways. Nothing in sight, don't think there
 will be again. Latter part squally with
 baffling winds general direction East. And so
 ends the day.

Tuesday Aug 26th 1884

Lat 33.34.50 Fore part of this day light easterly wind Brig
 Long 48.45 W. on both tacks. Middle part baffling easterly wind
 with occasional squalls. Employed in various ways.
 Broke out bread. Brig on the Northern tack
 Latter part moderate easterly wind
 Brig on the Northern tack by the wind

Wednesday Friday Aug 27th 1884

Lat 34.54.50 Fore and middle parts of this day moderate
 Long 48.48 W. winds baffling from East to South East.
 Broke out and lost an new Main Jib sail
 and Main Stay sail. Latter part moderate
 breeze from the S. E. And so ends the day.
