

Remarks on board

Thursday Aug 28th 1884

Lat 33.24 N. Fore and middle parts of this day moderate
Long 41.41 W. winds from S. by S. to S. Brig on the
northern tack. 13 who out water. hung a new
Grind stone, and employed in various other ways.
Latter part light winds from the S. S. E.
Brig heading to the Eastward

Friday Aug 29th 1884

Lat 33.44 N. Fore and middle part of this day moderate
Long 46.40 W. Southwesterly winds. Ship on the Eastern tack
Past through several heavy tide rips this afternoon.
Nothing in sight shortened sail at sundown.
Latter part light Southwesterly winds Brig on the
Eastern tack

Saturday Aug 30th 1884

N. O. 12. Fore part of this day light wind from the Southeast
having S. S. E. Middle part glassy with wind
from the same quarter. At 2.45 P. M. raised
a large white mist on the sea 3 or 4 miles
for it but did not see it again. Past 13
sail at day light this morning, steering to the N. W.
Latter part light Southwesterly winds Brig on
the Eastern tack.

Sunday Aug 31st 1884

Lat 36.11 N. Fore and middle parts of this day fine clear weather
Long 48.33 W. with light wind from South to S. S. W. heading
to the S. S. E. One sail in sight on the weather
13 seen. Saw a school of Grampuses. Latter part
light Southwesterly winds Brig on the Eastern tack

Monday Sept 1st 1884

Lat 30.00 N. Fore and middle parts of this day light
Long 42.25 W. Southwesterly winds Brig on the Starboard tack
Broke out 1 down, Bread. Coffee. water and
Molasses. Two sails and one Steamie
Latter part light Southwesterly winds, heading
to the S. S. E.

Tuesday Sept 2nd 1884

Lat 35.37 N. Fore and middle part of this day light wind
Long 46.21 W. from S. to W. S. W. Brig on the Starboard
tack. Employed in various ways. Saw
Three Grampuses to day. Latter part light
winds from W. S. W. Brig by the wind on
the Starboard tack.

Wednesday Sept 3rd 1884

Lat 35.28 N. Fore part of this day light W. S. W. winds
Long 40.44 W. Middle part fine clear weather with light
winds from W. S. W. to N. W. Steering E.
Employed in setting up the head gear.
One Steamie passed at 4 P. M. steering
W. S. W. Latter part moderate wind from
W. by N. Brig by the wind on the Starboard tack

Thursday Sept 4th 1884

Lat 36.00 N. Fore part of this day moderate westerly wind
Long 46.28 W. Brig by the wind on the Starboard tack under short
sail. Middle part moderate wind from the W. S. W.
Steering N. W. to North 12. H. Clock and this time
at 6. until sundown. Employed in various ways.
Latter part moderate S. W. wind Brig
on the Starboard tack under short sail
