

Remarks on board of

Saturday Sept 13th 1884
Fore and middle part of this day light wind and calm from N.W. to South. Brig on the port tack by the ground. One steamer and one schooner in sight. Latter part light southerly winds.

Sunday Sept 14th 1884
Fore part of this day begins with moderate breeze. Middle part fresh breeze increasing to a brisk gale at sundown. Brig on the starboard tack under short sail. Latter part blowing a heavy gale from the S.E. Brig under goose wing fore top sail and stern staysails. Strip all the boats.

Monday Sept 15th 1884
Fore part of this day begins with a very heavy gale from the S.E. veering to S.W. with heavy rain squalls and a very sharp heavy sea running. I took in the gangway board and started the forward davits to the larboard and main boats. Hauled the fore topmast stay wire at one o'clock A.M. Pumping ship every hour all through the night. Middle part gale moderated to a strong breeze veering to the N.W. in the latter part of the afternoon. Set the fore top sail close reefed and fore sail. Employed in various ways. Latter part more still a moderating.

Tuesday Sept 16th 1884
This day begins with light wind and calm from the Southward. Middle part wind grew to the westward and freshened to a brisk breeze. Latter part

Wednesday Sept 17th 1884
Fore part of this day begins with heavy rain from the N.W. Middle part strong westerly wind. Brig under single reef top sail by the wind on the western tack. Latter part moderate wind from the Northward under short sail.

Thursday Sept 18th 1884
Fore part of this day begins with fresh breeze from the N.W. Brig on the starboard tack. Middle part fresh breeze from the N.W. veering to E. Employed in drying the cutting gear and in making out water ship by the wind under all plain sail. Latter part moderate weather with wind at East. The Brig is still a making. was pumping twice a day.

Friday Sept 19th 1884
Fore and middle part of this fine clear weather with the wind from E. to S.E. Brig by the wind on the starboard tack. Employed in making a new gangway board and in various ways. Latter part light wind from the Westward.

Saturday Sept 20th 1884
Fore and middle part of this fine clear weather with the wind at S.E. Employed in cleaning the windlass and in various other ways. One bark and one steamer in sight. Brig by the wind on both tacks. Latter part calm. Brig under hot sail on the starboard tack.
