

## Remarks on board of

Schooner Jan 15<sup>th</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day strong N.E. gale breeze blowing along the land of the Island of Jago until 2 P.M. Howard and sent on shore the starboard boat at 2 P.M. Towing of anchor the rest of the fore part. Boat returned at 6 P.M. wind light and squally. Four men from shore came off in the boat. Middle part light wind and calm, making off the land. Latter part moderate E. by N. breeze. Brig by the wind on the port tack under all sail. Towing about 5000 strokes per day.

Friday Jan 16<sup>th</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day moderate E. by N. wind. Middle and latter part fine clear weather with a moderate breeze from E. N. E. Brig by the wind on the port tack. The vessel is still making water fairly. Employed in various ways. Saw Black fish this morning. Lat. 12:43. N Long 22:30 West.

Saturday Jan 17<sup>th</sup> 1885

This day begins with fine weather and moderate E. N. E. wind. For the middle and latter part light N. E. by E. breeze. Brig by the wind on the port tack. Employed in various ways.

Sunday Jan 18<sup>th</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day light N. E. by E. wind. Brig under all sail. Middle part light wind from N. E. Latter part light wind and calm with rain. Thunder and lightning. Saw a school of black fish at 11 A.M. Howard and go ashore. No Obs.

Monday Jan 19<sup>th</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day light N. E. wind and calm with frequent rain showers. At 12:30 struck a black fish and one struck another got both along side at 2 and cleared them away. Starboard and larboard boats got the fish. Middle and latter parts light squally wind from N. N. W. to N. E. Brig under all sail steering E. by E. Employed in clearing up the black fish.

Lat. 10:41 N. Long 18:28 West

Tuesday Jan 20<sup>th</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day light N. E. wind with fine weather. Saw Black fish at 12:20 P.M. Howard the Larboard and starboard boats got 2 each the waist boat 3. kept them along side at 5 P.M. Middle and latter parts moderate wind from N. E. by N. Employed in clearing away the black fish. Furlled the light sail at sundown. Brig by the wind and steering S. by E.

Lat. 10:00 North. Long 18:30 West

Wednesday Jan 21<sup>st</sup> 1885

For the fore part of this day moderate N. E. by N. wind employed in various ways. Middle and latter parts fresh breeze from the Northward steering south for the latter part. Boiled out the black fish in the middle part. The vessel making a great deal of water.

Lat 9:13. N. Long 17:43 West
