Commenced with Brisk Breezes from the S.E. & Steered North at 1 P.M. took up the Fore Top sail to repair it at 4 P.M. finished it and unbut the other one bent and set the cruising one. Midle part Brisk Breezes at the S.E. latter part the same took up the Main Top sail to fix it and got about the Bow Boat So ends with cloudy weather

Commenced with Brisk winds from the S.E. & Steered North at 2 P.M. finished the Main Top sail unbut the other and bent and set it at 5 P.M. took up the Mizzen Top sail unbut the passage one and bent and set the cruising one at 6 P.M. in one key of the Top sails and in Top Gallant sail and the air sail and jib. Midle part by by wind with the head yards aback at 3 P.M. Ship with the head yards aback still. Latter part at 5 P.M. hauled forward the yards and steered North at 7 P.M. saw the land of our Starboard bow saw some finbacks All Hand Variouslly Employed on Ships duty So ends with fine weather

Commenced with fine pleasant weather and a fair wind saw a great many black fish and saw a spout of a whale called it a finback bent the spanker Midle part much the same Latter part at 6 A.M. saw the land of our Starboard beam distance 14 miles saw a great many black fish at 12 midday saw a swordfish lowered one boat but did not get in All hands Employed in cleaning Ship So ends with pleasant weather

Commenced with fine breeze and pleasant weather got the anchors on the bow at 4 P.M. furled the Main sail Midle part Moderate winds latter part much the same In the Longitude of 77° 12' 150 days out

Commenced with Moderate winds from the S.E. & Steered N.W. by W saw a great many black fish and some small fish and passed red water Midle part fine winds and pleasant weather latter part Brisk breeze steered N.W. by W Employed in Taring the rigging & So ends these 24 hours nothing sight

Commenced with Brisk winds all hands employed in taring down the rigging Midle part much the same weather saw a whale at 9 P.M. Latter part saw a number of finbacks and black fish Employed in Taring down the rigging and various other jobs So ends with pleasant weather Longitude of 80° 20' 132 days out

Commenced with Brisk winds Employed in Taring the rigging and so forth Midle part steady breeze & Latter part Brisk winds and pleasant weather at 4 A.M. saw two points of our Starboard bow running down before the wind at 9 A.M. spoke her and found it to be the Brig Elizabeth of England says out from Calio and 3 years from England bound to Port Rico the Men Variouslly Employed on Ships duty So ends

Commenced with Brisk winds from the S.E. Steered S.W. by W saw a great many finbacks and black fish Midle part fine weather Latter part much the same All hands Variouslly employed on Ships duty So ends
Long by Acc 72

Friday
May 10th
1833.

4° 16'

Commenced with Brisk winds but variable Employed in Painting Midle part at 11 P.M. hauled by the wind expecting to see the land in the morning in fore key of the Top sail Latter part at 5 P.M. called all hands and out reys and set Top Gallant sail and jibs at 11 P.M. saw the land bearing E by S 2 S So ends with pleasant weather
