

Tuesday
October
15th 1833.
Lat 44° 06' N
Long 83° 18' W
Commenced with brisk wind and pleasant weather nothing in sight at 1 P.M. took in the top Gallant Sails by up 1 P.M. & 11 Miles part which the same latter part made sail again saw nothing from a left to end

Wednesday
October
16th 1833.
Lat 44° 06' N
Long 82° 12' W
Commenced with brisk wind Steered E by N at 8 P.M. took in top Gallant Sails and firs and spunked. Middle part the same latter part at 4 P.M. saw Island of St. Helena bearing E by S distance 20 miles being in the latitude of 4° 06' N and Longitude 22° 04' W being about one degree further to the westward than it is laid down in the chart

Thursday
October
17th 1833.
Lat 2° 18' N
Long 40° 17' W
Commenced with moderate breeze steering down part of the ship at 3 P.M. saw porpoises and took on Middle part by up from S to S.E. latter part the same strong winds saw porpoises so ended these 24 hours

Friday
October
18th 1833.
Lat 1° 59' N
Long 78° 30' W
Commenced with strong wind by up S.S.E. saw nothing Middle part the same latter part made sail and stood in for the land at saw porpoises so ended

Saturday
October
19th 1833.
Lat 1° 59' N
Long 79° 10' W
Commenced with brisk wind headed in for the land at 1 P.M. saw the land stood in until 2 P.M. took on ship saw a small Brig steering to the northward and eastward at 3 P.M. saw and spoke with the Rambler of Antwerp Capt. Drerick 18 months out with 1300 bbls at 6 P.M. shortened sail Middle part the same latter part fine weather saw no whales the Rambler still in company

Sunday
October
20th 1833.
Lat 4° 06' N
Long 74° 54' W
Commenced with fine pleasant weather saw nothing Employed in repairing the sails at 3 P.M. saw the Rambler and boarded the ship occasionally Middle part were ship's latter part made sail saw nothing but porpoises at 4 P.M. saw the ship to the seaward of us 60 miles in company with the ship

Monday
October
21st 1833.
Commenced with moderate winds and pleasant weather Middle part the same latter part thick foggy rainy weather saw some spouts but could not tell what they were so ended in company with the Rambler and an English ship

Tuesday
October
22nd 1833.
Lat 4° 06' N
Long 75° 40' W
Commenced with thick rainy weather at 2 P.M. saw the Rambler heaving of a top she set her colours for whales at 3 P.M. saw the whales going quick to the ship at 4 P.M. saw the Rambler take a whale along side saw more whales to leeward kept off for then the English ship Providence came up and fastened and killed one at 5 P.M. lowered her boats but it being so late in the day could not get on board and shot her sail standing in for the land at 6 P.M. part were ship and stood off latter part the same strong winds saw nothing from the ship but the Rambler still in sight so ended

Wednesday
October
23rd 1833.
Lat 4° 06' N
Long 70° 27' W
Commenced with brisk wind saw nothing from a left to 4 P.M. run down and spoke the Rambler and boarded at 6 P.M. took in the main sail and top Gallant Sails at 9 P.M. were ship Middle part Moderate latter part strong wind at 4 P.M. saw beaches ahead at 7 P.M. the Rambler set her colours for whales at 10 P.M. saw her boats of she took two at 11 P.M. lowered her boats and chased to the seaward but did not fasten until 2 P.M. took one the other boats in chase so ended with strong winds and a plenty of wild whales

Thursday
October
24th 1833.
Lat 4° 06' N
Long 70° 27' W
Commenced with brisk wind Employed in chasing whale at 4 P.M. took the whale along side at 6 P.M. came on board a boat and commenced cutting at 8 P.M. finished cutting and set the water Middle part moderate latter part the same Employed in boiling saw nothing from a left to end

Friday
October
25th 1833.
Lat 4° 06' N
Long 70° 27' W
Commenced with moderate wind at 6 P.M. finished boiling and dashing of the decks Middle part fine weather latter part the same saw blackfish so ended - 10 months out

Saturday
October
26th 1833.
Commenced with fine pleasant weather at 2 P.M. saw the Rambler of our lie beam at 2 P.M. saw spouts of our lie beam kept off for then they proved to be black fish at 4 P.M. spoke the Rambler and boarded Middle part fine Moderate weather latter part thick wind saw nothing from a left in company with the Rambler so ended
