

60	Saturday November 23rd 1833 Commences with brisk winds tacked and stood in to the bay spoke the Charles Carroll of Baltimore in company with an English ship and the Benjamin Rush of Warren spoke part & Calm latter part light air cruising in the Bay Sunday November 24th 1833 Commences with light air and Calm saw no whale Miller and latter part the same Monday November 25th 1833 Commences with light winds at 4h spoke the Washington of Hanluet and boarded Miller part light winds and Calm latter part light steady breeze saw black fish and porpoises and saw 3 ships of the mouth of the Bay. So end 22 months out with 300 lbs of oil Tuesday November 26th 1833 Commences with moderate winds at 4h PM boarded the Charles Carroll in company with the English ship Stratford of London Capt. Lock Miller part stood out of the Bay latter part stood in at 10 AM left the Bay and Steered N.W. so end Wednesday November 27th 1833 Commences with Brisk wind steered of N.W. at 6 PM shortened sail Miller part Moderate winds latter part the same saw nothing from aloft so end employed in repairing sails Thursday November 28th 1833 Commences with Brisk wind steered of N.W. at 4h saw a finback Miller part pleasant latter part the same saw Porpoises employed in working Friday November 29th 1833 Commences with Brisk steering N.W. at 6 PM shortened sail and by 10 Miller part the same latter part made sail and Steered N.W. saw porpoises so end Saturday November 30th 1833 Commences with Moderate Breezes and Pleasant weather saw Cowfish at 6 PM shortened sail Miller part fine weather latter part Brisk winds saw nothing employed in repairing sails Sunday December 1st 1833 Commences with Brisk winds Miller and latter part the same saw nothing so end	61	Monday December 2nd 1833 Commences with light winds from the S.S. Steered West Miller part by 10 under short sail latter part set more sail saw porpoises so end employed in repairing sails Tuesday December 3rd 1833 Commences with fine pleasant weather at 6 PM shortened sail and by 10 Miller part some rain latter pleasant employed in repairing sails saw nothing from the Mast heads so end Wednesday December 4th 1833 Commences with light air and Calm Miller and latter part the same employed in repairing sails saw nothing from aloft so end Thursday December 5th 1833 Commences with Calm at 4h PM saw a large school of sperm whales put of 3 boats and killed two at 10 PM took them alongside chined down and set the 2nd 11 mile part employed in getting ready for cutting latter part at 6 AM commenced cutting at 6h saw sperm whales lowered all boats and killed 5 at 11 AM took them alongside so end with pleasant weather Friday December 6th 1833 Commences with fine weather employed in cutting at 4 PM finished cutting in 3 whales and commenced boiling Miller part some squalls of rain latter part finished cutting employed in boiling so end Saturday December 7th 1833 Commences with fine weather employed in boiling Miller part rainy latter part clear at 4 PM Long 28.32 Sunday December 8th 1833 Commences with rainy weather employed in boiling Miller part the same at 11 PM finished boiling latter part employed in putting the oil to set down so end Monday December 9th 1833 Commences with light air employed in Coopering oil to set down latter part commenced storing down at 4 AM saw sperm whales lowered 3 boats but did not fasten at 11 came on board
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
