

Monday April 7 th 1834	Commences with light increasing breezes from the North with a heavy swell Employed in setting up Rigging & Latter part the same saw the Simolian and Corinthian in the North passage one watch on shore	Wednesday April 9 th 1834	Commences with light Breezes one watch on Liberty at sunset all came off but one Black man by the name of Johnathan White who had deserted Latter part pleasant all hands on board So Ends
Tuesday April 8 th 1834	Commences with light wind and Calms at 4 PM the Corinthian came to anchor Latter part the Simolian Stonington Rod and Ampery came to anchor So Ends	Thursday April 10 th 1834	Commences with fine pleasant weather Employed in getting for sea Latter part at 5 AM have short stay 4 AM took our anchor and started for Rake in company with the Enterprise and Daniel Webster So Ends
Wednesday April 9 th 1834	Commences with light breezes the Pacific of New Bedford & Rakontus of Portsmouth came to anchor Latter part Employed in getting of potatoes and raising one watch on Liberty So Ends with light airs	Friday April 11 th 1834	Commences with high trades steering for Rake with all sail set at 6 PM came to anchor in 23 fathoms water outside of the bar Latter part Capt. and one Boat's crew on shore
Thursday April 10 th 1834	Commences with light airs and Calms Employed in getting on board produce from the shore Latter part the same at 10 AM the Arakella of Sach Harbour and Williams of Stonington came to anchor	Saturday April 12 th 1834	Commences with strong wind from the N.E. at 4 PM got under weigh and stood to sea steering S.W. in company with the Daniel Webster and Enterprise Employed in unloading cables and stowing anchors Which part Brisk trade Latter part the same Employed in repairing Boats and fitting for Whales So Ends
Friday April 11 th 1834	Commences with light winds and Calms Employed in getting on board recruits Latter part Employed in taking down the try works to rebuild them So Ends	Sunday April 13 th 1834	Commences with Brisk trade all hand Carried by employed on board Which fine Breezes Latter part the same in company with the Enterprise and Dr. Webster
Saturday April 12 th 1834	Commences with light winds from the Southward and westward Employed Various by on board Latter part the same the Gen. Coffin and the Thomas Williams arrived here this morning So Ends	Monday April 14 th 1834	Commences with light Breezes steering to the N by S at 4 PM spoke the two ships and boarded Which part fine weather Latter part light winds the Watch variously employed
Sunday April 13 th 1834	Commences with light winds and pleasant weather Employed in getting ready to build over try works Latter part fine weather one watch on Liberty	Tuesday April 15 th 1834	Commences with light airs in company with the two ships Which part fine Breeze Latter part Brisk trades steered N by S the watch employed in repairing boats So Ends the two ships in company
