Commenced with light breezes from the S.E. Steered to the S.W. with all sail set at 4 P.M. took on reef in the Top Sails and set the Top Gallant sail over them. Middle part thick foggy weather latter part the same set all sail saw porpoises and squid sounds steering to the S.W. with light winds

Monday

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. Steered S.W. with all sail set. Middle part the same latter part moderate weather saw nothing from a left sounds three hours

Tuesday
July 4th

Commenced with moderate winds and pleasant weather headed to the S.W. with all sail set at 4 P.M. took on reef in the Top Sails Middle part much the same latter part light winds and pleasant weather saw nothing so ends

Wednesday
July 5th

Commenced with light winds and pleasant weather Steered to the N.W. saw nothing Middle and latter part the same so ends

Thursday
July 6th
1834

Commenced with light airs and calms Middle and latter part the same saw finbacks so ends three twenty four hours

Friday
July 7th
1834

Commenced with calm weather Middle and latter part light airs and pleasant weather saw a great many finbacks and black fish so ends all well on board

Saturday
July 8th
1834

Commenced with light airs at 8 P.M. spoke the Woodlark of Sidney 4 months out with 200 blb. Capt. Grimes middle part by under short sail latter part set all sail light airs and calm saw finbacks and black fish so ends in company with the Woodlark

Sunday
July 9th
1834

Commenced with light airs and calm saw finbacks employed in mending the sparboard at 4 P.M. finished and sent it at 4 P.M. took in sail Middle part light airs latter part made sail at 5 1/2 P.M. saw sperm whales lowered all boats and chased till 10 A.M. came on board and got dinner and then lowered

Monday
July 10th
1834

Commenced with light winds employed in chasing whales at 3 P.M. came on board and took up the Boat Whales going very quick to the S.E. saw the Woodlark to leeward at 7 P.M. took in sail headed to the N.W. Latter part made sail at 5 A.M. saw sperm whales lowered all boats the waist Boat struck 3 whales the lines parted each time lost then with 5 rows and 1/2 fathoms of line the larboard struck and killed one large whale took him along side at 10 A.M. the larboard Boat got badly stove saw a great many whales and saw a ship to leeward so ends



Tuesday
July 11th
1834

Commenced with moderate breezes employed in cutting at 4 P.M. finished cutting and set the quarter watch saw a number of whales in the afternoon at 4 P.M. strong winds Middle part the same by by under close reef Main Top Sails and stay sail latter part set the fore sail and commenced boiling saw the Woodlark to leeward so ends with strong gales and squally with light rain

Wednesday
July 12th
1834

Commenced with strong winds employed in Boiling Middle part at 11 P.M. heavy squalls of rain put out the fire latter part more moderate at 2 A.M. commenced boiling again at 8 A.M. spoke the Atlantic of Nantucket 22 months out with 125 blb at 8 1/2 A.M. saw sperm whales going to leeward it being very rugged did not lower our boats the Atlantic passed the boats but did not get anything so ends

Thursday
July 13th
1834

Commenced with strong winds at 6 P.M. finished Boiling Middle part heavy squalls latter part strong gales attended with heavy showers of rain and thunder and lightning at 11 A.M. saw a ship of the weather bow so ends

Friday
July 14th
1834

Commenced with heavy gales at 4 P.M. spoke the Rebecca Sims 22 months out with 155 blb at 4 P.M. took in the Top Sails Middle part the same latter part more moderate employed in cooping oil saw two ships so ends with strong wind
