July 25th
1834
Commenced with brisk wind and squally
saw nothing from aloft in company
with the Mariner at 7 PM took in sail
Middle part the same Latter part took
ship set double Reef Top Sails jib and
spanker and Main Sail saw nothing the
Cambria out of sight so ends with squally weather

Saturday
July 26th
1834
Lat 24-40
Long 153-20
Commenced with brisk wind and squally
saw nothing from aloft at 7 PM took in
and sail by up 4 N & Middle part the
same Latter part made sail at 8 AM saw
sperm whales lowered 3 Boats and killed one
took him alongside at 11 AM



Sunday
July 27th
1834
Commenced with brisk wind and squally
Employed in cutting at 4 PM finished and
commenced boiling Middle and Latter
part the same saw nothing from aloft

Monday
July 28th
1834
Commenced with moderate wind and headed
to the Northward under short sail at
6 PM finished boiling and took in sail
Middle part the same Latter part set close
reef Top Sails at 7 AM flayed a colored
man by the name of Charles Griffin for
abusive language and misconduct saw
nothing from aloft so ends

Tuesday
July 29th
1834
Lat 29-37
Long 153-14
Commenced with brisk wind saw nothing
from aloft at 7 took in the Top Sails
Middle part the same Latter part strong in
made sail accordingly at 10 AM spoke the
Mariner of Nantucket Capt. Colman 23
miles out with 1150 lbs of oil so ends

Wednesday
July 30th
1834
Lat 29-28
Commenced with strong wind in company
with the Mariner at 4 PM wore ship
by up 8 N & at 7 took in sail Middle part
the same Latter part set the Double Reef
Top Sails jib spanker and Main Sail saw
nothing from aloft so ends in company
with the Mariner

Thursday
July 31st
1834
Commenced with strong wind from the
eastward by up 8 by 3 in company with the
Mariner saw nothing from aloft at
7 PM took in sail Middle part the
same Latter part made sail saw nothing
so ends with the same wind and weather

Friday
August 1st
1834
Commenced with strong wind from the
Eastward by up on our starboard tack saw
jumper at 4 PM took in sail Latter
part made sail in company with the
Mariner saw nothing from aloft Employed
in cooping the oil to stow down so ends

Saturday
August 2nd
1834
Lat 28-25
Commenced with strong wind saw a num-
ber of finbacks at the Top Gallant sails at
7 PM shortened sail and by by Latter part
Employed in stowing oil so ends in company
with the Mariner

Sunday
August 3rd
1834
Commenced with strong wind at 5 1/2 finished
stowing down and set the Mainsail and
washed off the decks at 3 PM lost sight of
the other ship at 4 PM took in sail and
by up N & Middle part squally attended
with rain Latter part strong wind saw
the other ship to leeward so ends

Monday
August 4th
1834
Lat 29-20
Long 155-57
Commenced with brisk wind saw finbacks
at 4 shortened sail Middle part the
same Latter part fine weather and
brisk breezes saw finbacks breaching
so ends with the Mariner in company

Tuesday
August 5th
1834
Commenced with brisk wind from the
South and East steered by N at 5 PM
spoke the Mariner at 8 took in sail
Middle part the same Latter part made
all sail saw finbacks porpoises and squid
so ends the other ship to windward

Wednesday
August 6th
1834
Commenced with moderate wind and pleasant
weather steered by N in company
with the Mariner at 7 took in sail
and heeled by the wind Latter part set
all sail and steered by N & at 11 AM
lost sight of the other ship saw
finbacks and squid so ends
