

Monday
Sept 15th 1834
30° 25'
177° 38' E
Commenced with fine weather made all sail
the main from the S.E. side of the ship
A part the same latter part light wind
steered by S with all sail set saw a great
number of birds so ends

Tuesday
Sept 16th 1834
30° 05' N
179° 00' E
Commenced with light wind by up S & saw
nothing. Made part steered S by E latter part
the same saw a great number of birds emp-
loyed in rattling down the main rigging and
making a fly jib boom so ends

Wednesday
Sept 17th 1834
30° 30' N
179° 46' E
Commenced with light wind by up S & E at
6 P.M. took in sail and steered East. At
A part the latter part made sail and
steered S & E saw porpoises so ends variously
employed on ship's duty

Thursday
Sept 18th 1834
Commenced with light air by up S & saw
nothing employed in scraping and burnish-
ing the keel at 6 P.M. took in sail
and wore ship by up N by N made part the
same latter part made all sail and steered
East took in the Bow Boat to paint her saw
nothing from aloft so ends with fine weather

Friday
Sept 19th 1834
29° 02' N
179° 15' W
Commenced with light wind from the
West steered East at 5 P.M. saw small
breaches at 5 P.M. spoke the Boy of Warren
Capt. Champman 13 months out with 500 lbs
which part much the same latter part strong
wind and squally in 2 groups of the top sails
so ends in company with the Boy

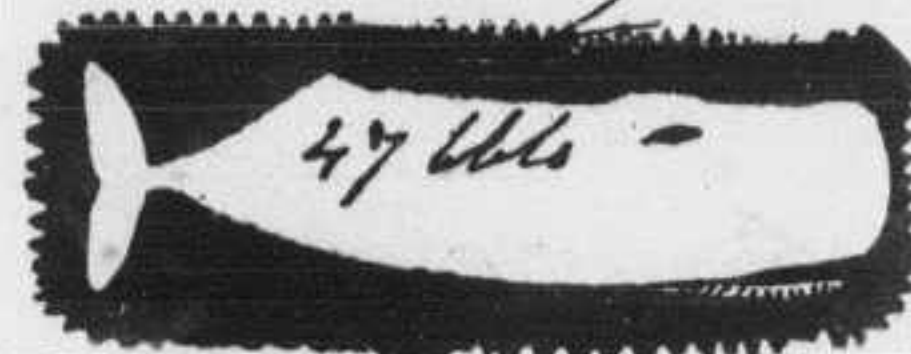
Saturday
Sept 20th 1834
Commenced with strong wind from the
Westward in 3 reefs of the top sails and in
jib and spanker at 4 P.M. saw sperm
Whales lowered 3 boats and killed one and
took her alongside at 8 P.M. took in sail
and by by which part raving with brisk
wind latter part employed in cutting at
3 A.M. finished and commenced boiling
so ends with strong wind the other ship
in sight



Monday
Sept 21st 1834
Commenced with strong wind and a large
see employed in boiling at 3 P.M. took in
the main top sail which part light wind
set the main top sail latter part at 5 A.M.
finished boiling set the single reefed top
sail jib and spanker and main sail so ends
with moderate weather in company with the Boy

Tuesday
Sept 22nd 1834
Commenced with moderate wind at 4 P.M.
spoke the Boy at 6 P.M. shortened sail latter
part at 8 A.M. made sail at 11 A.M. saw sperm
Whales to leeward kept of for them in company
with the Boy did not leave before dinner

Wednesday
Sept 23rd 1834
Commenced with light air lowered all boats
and struck two whales the Bow boat got
stove wait boat took her line but the
boatster got the line around his wrist was
obliged to cut but one line and one from
the Larboard boat took her whale alongside
at 3 P.M. more whales in sight part
of boat did not get any more sperm
latter part strong wind and squally at
11 P.M. finished cutting and commenced boil-
ing so ends



Thursday
Sept 24th 1834
Commenced with strong wind from the West
and employed in boiling saw a number of
ships at 5 P.M. spoke the Peruvian Capt. Briggs
hall 25 months out with 1650 lbs & turning to
the Eastward with all sail out which part
light wind latter part moderate breeze made
sail saw nothing from aloft employed in
boiling so ends

Friday
Sept 25th 1834
Commenced with moderate wind and pleas-
ant saw nothing at 5 P.M. finished boiling
at 6 P.M. took in sail and by by head to the North
which part the same latter part made
all sail steered to the N and E employed in
stowing down side in the ground forward on
the Larboard side saw nothing from aloft
so ends with light air and pleasant weather
