

Thursday
October
9th 1834
Lat 31° 11' N
Long 161° 16' W
Commences with moderate wind and pleasant weather by up N by E. Middle part the same. Latter part light winds saw nothing from afloat so ends there at Low

Friday
October
10th 1834
Lat 32° 21' N
Long 161° 6' W
Commences with light winds and pleasant weather saw nothing from afloat employed in mending the fly jib. Middle part by up ENE. Latter part calm at 11 AM. Light breeze from the North and Eastward. Employed in paying the haws and varnishing the waistbands.

Saturday
October
11th 1834
Lat 32° 11' N
Long 160° 49' W
Commences with light winds from the Northward by up East at 1 PM. Unbent the fore top sail to repair and bent a new one. Middle part light winds and calm. Latter part at 3 PM moderate increasing breeze from the NW. At 4 PM sail and stored ENE at 6 AM squally and the wind from the North attended with strong winds in fore gallant sails and in 2nd reef of the top sail and in jib so ends with strong winds.

Sunday
October
12th 1834
Lat 31° 17' N
Long 160° 20' W
Commences with strong winds from the North. Lead up ENE at 12 PM. The wind increasing in 2nd reef of the fore top sail. Middle part at 11 PM in main sail. Latter part much the same. Set the mainsail again so ends.

Monday
October
13th 1834
Lat 31° 29' N
Long 160° 36' W
Commences with strong winds from the North by up E by N under thick reef. Fore and main and double main top sail and fore and main sail. Middle part by up ENE very squally at 11 PM took in the main sail. Latter part the same wind and weather. Set the mainsail so ends.

Tuesday
October
14th 1834
Lat 31° 36' N
Long 160° 36' W
Commences with strong winds and squally weather from the North by up E by N under close reef. Top sails and courses. Middle part by up N by E. At out one reef of the main top sail. Latter part at 2 PM heavy squalls of wind and rain in 3rd reef of the main top sail and in fore and main courses at 6 AM more moderate out one reef of the main top sail and set the fore and main courses so and with heavy squalls of rain and wind.

Wednesday
October
15th 1834
Lat 31° 31' N
Long 161° 51' W
Commences with strong wind and squally attended with rain at 1 PM more moderate to set the jib and spanker and one reef out of the fore and main top sail at 4 PM more heavy squalls of wind and rain in reef and in jib and spanker wind from the N by E by N by E. Middle part at 10 PM the wind turned to the West attended with heavy squalls of wind and rain. Stowed E by E at 2 AM out 2nd reef of the top sail at 3 PM the wind increasing in reef and in main sail. Latter part more moderate out 3rd reef of the top sail and set the jib and main sail so on with squally weather saw a water spout.

Thursday
October
16th 1834
Lat 32° 20' N
Long 161° 56' W
Commences with strong winds from the West. Stowed E by E set the top gallant sails over double reef. Top sails. Middle part brisk wind and clear weather set the top gallant sails over single reef. Top sails. Latter part strong wind and squally from 11 o'clock till noon at 9 PM unbent the fore sail and main top sail and bent new ones so ends.

Friday
October
17th 1834
Lat 32° 16' N
Long 160° 30' W
Commences with strong winds and squally weather attended with rain in fore and main sails and 2nd reef of the top sails and in main sail wind from the NW. Stowed E by N by E at 4 PM fine weather. Middle part at 10 PM by E by S wind set all sail. Latter part fine pleasant weather winds the same so ends at 4 PM longitude by the chronometer was 160° 20' W.

Saturday
October
18th 1834
Lat 32° 16' N
Long 158° 13' W
Commences with fine weather and brisk wind from the NW by S. Stowed E by N by E with all sail set. Middle part light winds. Latter part light winds and calm so ends.

Sunday
October
19th 1834
Lat 31° 45' N
Long 157° 15' W
Commences with light air from the N by E by the wind on our larboard tack at 3 PM shifted our anchors. Middle part light wind. Latter part thick squally weather so ends.
