Thursday Jan 8th 1835 Left 6.17.0 Long 160.29	Commenced with light airs and Calm at 6 PM finished the Top sail Middle part the same latter part employed in painting the boat and lower Mast so on in company with the Amethyst	Friday January 8th 1835	Commenced with strong winds by up S by E at 8 PM lost sight of the Amethyst on the opposite tack at 1 PM took a ship by up N by E Middle part the same weather by up N by E latter part at 4 PM took a squall ahead heaved round the yards at 8 PM were back again the wind increasing in top gullant gusts so on
