

## Remarks on board Brig E. H. Adams

Sunday Nov 6<sup>th</sup>

Light wind from the N.E.  
Steering by the wind on the  
Starboard tack. At 5.30 P.M. took  
in sail and lay to on the  
Starboard tack with the fore sail  
set. so ends this day

Lat 30° 04' N.  
Long 75° 29' W.

Nov 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light easterly winds.  
Course N.W. One sail in sight.  
Watch employed doing ships duty  
At 5.30 took in sail and  
and lay to on the Port tack  
so ends this day

Lat 30° 52' N.  
Long 76° 45' W.

Nov 8<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze from the S.E. Saw  
one Merchant Bark. at 1 o'clock  
P.M. saw several small white water  
which proved to be pumpers.  
At 5 P.M. spoke the whaling  
Schooner E.B. Conwell of New  
Bedford. Watch employed at  
doing ships duty. At 5.30 P.M.  
took in sail and lay to on the  
Port tack with the fore sail  
set. so ends this day.

Nov 9<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze from the S.E.  
Schooner E.B. Conwell in sight. Watch  
employed at doing ships duty  
At 5.30 P.M. took in sail and lay  
to on the Port tack so ends this day  
Lat 31° 38' N.  
Long 76° 20' W.

Nov 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a strong breeze from  
the S.E. and veered gradually  
to the West and increased to  
a gale. One Bark and one  
Schooner in sight. Watch  
employed at doing ships duty  
At 6 P.M. Brig laying to on  
the starboard tack under  
short sail. so ends this day  
Lat 31° 41' N.  
Long 75° 45' W.

Nov 11<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a strong breeze from  
the N.W. which moderated  
gradually during the day.  
Course S by W. One sail  
in sight. Watch employed  
doing ships duty. so ends  
this day

Lat 31° 08' N.  
Long 75° 45' W.
