

Remarks of a Whaling voyage on board

Saturday Nov 12th

Strong breeze from the N.W.W. Steering S.W. Three sails in sight. Watch employed at breaking out the hold, and doing other sundry jobs. At 5³⁰ took in sail and lay to on the starboard tack. So ends this day. Lat 29° 48' N. Long 76° 12' W.

Nov 13th

Light variable winds. One sail in sight. at 5³⁰ took in sail and lay to on the starboard tack so ends this day. Lat 29° 46' N. Long 77° 12' W.

Nov 14th

Begins with light variable winds. At 9.30 a.m. a light breeze began to blow from the south which increased during the day. At 5³⁰ P.M. took in sail and lay to on the starboard tack. So ends this day. Lat 29° 45' N. Long 78° 42' W.

Sunday Nov 15th

Begins with a heavy gale from the west. At 3 a.m. reflect the waist boat over. an. Gale continued throughout the day. Brig leaking very bad. So ends this day.

Lat 31° 10' N
Long 75° 20' W

Nov 16th

Begins with a strong wind from the N.W.W. At 9 a.m. set the waist boat on the crane. Latter part light variable winds. At 4.30 P.M. a large steamer past steering about N. by E. Watch employed doing ships duty. At 5³⁰ took in sail and lay to on the port tack. So ends this day.

Lat 31° 06' N
Long 76° 16' W

Nov 17th

Begins with a light breeze from the S.S.W. which gradually increased during the period N.E. from 6.30 a.m. to 5³⁰ P.M. then took in sail and lay to on the port tack. So ends this day.

Lat 31° 31' N
Long 75° 24' W
