

## Remarks of a Whaling voyage on board

Thursday Nov 24<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds from the ENE with frequent squalls with rain. Watch employed setting up the Foretop and foretop-gallant mast back stays. Two large Ships past by steering to the Northward. Pumps carefully attended to Brig under short sail on the Port tack. So ends this day.

Lat -  $30^{\circ} 30' - N$   
Long -  $69^{\circ} 31' - W$

Nov 25<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from the ENE Brig under short sail on the Port tack until 10 AM On the Starboard tack the rest of the day. Watch employed at breaking out Water Molasses oil and bread and doing other sundry jobs. Pumps carefully attended to So ends this day.

Lat  $30^{\circ} 03' - N$   
Long  $69^{\circ} 00' - W$

Nov 26<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds from ENE Brig laying under short sail on the Starboard tack until 6 PM on the Port tack the rest of the day. Pumps carefully attended to So ends this day. Lat  $30^{\circ} 51' - N$   
Long  $69^{\circ} 50' - W$

Sunday Nov 27<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from the ENE with a heavy sea running Brig under short sail on the Port tack. Pumps carefully attended to every four hours Brig taking two hundred strokes an hour. Charlie Briggs. Frank Mc Arthur off duty sick So ends this day.

Lat  $30^{\circ} 50' - N$   
Long  $70^{\circ} 20' - W$

Monday Nov 28<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from the ENE Brig under short sail on the Starboard tack. Pumps carefully attended to taking two hundred strokes an hour. So ends this day.

Lat  $30^{\circ} 39' - N$   
Long  $72^{\circ} 00' - W$

Nov 29<sup>th</sup>

Squally weather with rain very light winds from different directions. Watch employed at making several mats and doing other jobs. Pumps attended to. So ends this.

Lat  $30^{\circ} 30' - N$ .

The uncertain Long  $71^{\circ} 49' - W$ . wind began to blow hard from the WNE at 9 o'clock. Rolled over the WB and took the things out of the Starboard and Starboard.
