Thursday Dec 22nd

At anchor at Port Royal.
Second mate setting up the main
rigging. A carpenter at work on
the port side of the vessel caulking.
The crew still off duty. Watchman
came on board at 6 30 P.M.
Albert & Vaughan is in jail

Dec 23rd

At anchor at Port Royal
Fore part of the day cloudy but no rain
Carpenter worked untill noon.
At 1 P.M. it began to rain and rained
the rest of the day. Crew still refuse
to work. Watchman came on board
at 6 P.M. To endr this day

Dec 24th

At anchor at Port Royal
Rained hard all day. Crew still
refused to work. Watchman came
on board at 6 P.M. To endr this day

Dec 25th

Cloudy and cold but no rain.
Crew still refuse to work.
Watchman came on board at 6 P.M.
To endr this day

Monday Dec 26th

At anchor at Port Royal
Calm pleasant weather. Carpenter at
work making Bearers and cranes.
Crew at work. Three men from shore
working on board breaking out the
after hold to tip the vessel down
by the head to caulk the stern.
Loosed all the sails and dried
them To endr this day
Watchman came on board at 6 P.M.

Dec 27th

At anchor at Port Royal
Carpenter at work caulking the
stern. Calm pleasant weather
Watch came on board at 6 P.M.

Dec 28th

At anchor at Port Royal
Strong wind from the N.W.
Four men from shore at work
break down the after hold.
Carpenter at work on the Bullworks
Larvits and bearers. Broke out
Pork. Watchman came on board
at 6 P.M.
Joe Gomez and the Cook
deserted some time during
the night.
