Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Monday Jan 16th

Begins with light easterly. at 8:30 P.M. winch hauled to the Northard made sail and steered east by North. Broke out Beef Pork. water. & Vinegar. Pumps attended to

So ends This day.

Lat - 28° 55' N

Long 62° 54' W

Tuesday Jan 17th

Begins with a strong breeze from the NNE with frequent squalls and gradually increased to a gale. At 6 A.M. took in all but the storm sails and lay to on the Port Tack. Later part more moderate at 7 o'clock made more sail and steered east. Saw three sails. Pumps carefully attended to taking about three hundred strokes an hour. So ends This day

Lat - 28° 55' N

Long 61° 17' W

Wednesday Jan 18th

Begins with a light wind from N.N.E. Steering East. latter part calm with a heavy swell. One sail in sight So ends This day

Lat 60° 08' Long 28° 24'

Thursday Jan 19th

Moderate gale from the Westward Steering E by N. Pumps attended to taking nearly three hundred strokes an hour (Lat - 29° 10' N So ends This day Long 58° 35' W

Friday Jan 20th

Begins with a strong breeze from N.W. latter part more moderate Steering E by N. Taking three hundred strokes an hour. Watch employed doing ship's duty. So ends This day Lat - 29° 40' N Long 55° 13' W

Sat Jan 21st

Begins with very light variable winds Steering East. latter part wind very light and from the Southward Pumps carefully attended to Broke out water Molasses & oil. Saw one fin back. So ends This day

Lat - 29° 36' N

Long 74° 54' W

Sunday Jan 22nd

Light westerly winds Steering E by S. Pumps attended to. So ends This day

Lat - 29° 19'

Long 53° 02'
