Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Friday March 2nd

Light N.E. trader. St. Nicolav
in sight. Saw one humpback.
Watch employed at ships duty.
Carried sail all night - Steering
for Brava. So ends this day
Lat $16^{\circ}25'N$
Long $24^{\circ}02'W$

Sat March 3rd

Strong N.E. trader. Lay off and
on at Brava. Boat went on
shore at 1 P.M. and came back
at 5:30 P.M. Capt Martin
stayed on shore all night -

Sunday March 4th

Lay off and on at Brava
Capt Martin on shore with
boat crew. Boat and crew
came on board at 5 P.M.
Capt still on shore So ends
this day.

Monday March 5th

Laying off and on at Brava Capt
Martin on shore. James Macnamara
Charles Hamilton, & S. F. McArthur
deserted to day. So ends this
day.

Tuesday March 6th

Laying off and on at Brava
Capt Martin on shore.
Fred Kidson deserted to day.
Also Charles Krigger. So ends this day.

Wed March 7th

Laying off and on at Brava.
Capt Martin on shore.
So ends this day.

Thursday March 8th

Laying off and on at Brava.
Took twelve men in lieu of the five
that deserted. to be shipped at
Barclaycloe. Capt Martin came
on board at 5 P.M. At six P.M.
Took our departure from Brava
and shaped our course for sea
Moderate N.E. trader Steering W.
So ends this day.

Friday March 9th

Moderate N.E. Trade wind.
Watch employed at doing ships
duty. Several sails in sight.
Lay to under short sail during
the night.

Lat $17^{\circ}15'N$
Long $26^{\circ}10'W$
