

Remarks on board Brig. E. H. Adams

Monday March 26th

Light N.E. trade winds
Clear pleasant weather nothing
in sight. Sounded this day
Lat $14^{\circ} 52'$ N
Long $84^{\circ} 41'$ W

Tuesday March 27th
Light N.E. trade wind. Very
cloudy with some rain.
Saw a large school of cowfish -
To end this day Lat $13^{\circ} 46'$
Long $85^{\circ} 00'$

Wednesday March 28th

Moderate N.E. trades. Very cloudy
One sail in sight. Put new
leathers on the pump. Leak
about the same as usual.
To end this day Lat $13^{\circ} 05'$
Long $85^{\circ} 40'$

Thursday March 29th

Moderate N.E. trade winds
Nothing in sight. Put new
tarsol lashing on fore top
sail yard. Lowered the
three boats for practice
To end this day Lat $14^{\circ} 03'$ N
Long $86^{\circ} 02'$ W

Friday March 30th

Light N.E. trade wind
Lowered the two port boats
for Blackfish's waist boat
hoist one and brought it along
side at 5 P.M. To end this day
Lat $14^{\circ} 44'$ N
Long $87^{\circ} 12'$ W

Saturday March 31st

Moderate N.E. trade wind
Tried out the Blackfish
Very clear and pleasant
To end this day Lat $14^{\circ} 08'$
Long $87^{\circ} 01'$

Sunday March April 1st

Moderate N.E. trade wind
One merchant vessel in sight
To end this day Lat $13^{\circ} 30'$ N
Long $85^{\circ} 22'$ W

Monday April 2nd

Begin with light N.E. trades
Saw a large white water on the
Lu. quarter at half past five
P.M. Kept off but did not
get near enough to see what
made it. One sail in sight
Circle with strong breeze
from the S.E. Lat $14^{\circ} 11'$ N
Long $86^{\circ} 13'$ W

Saw large white water
