Thursday April 26th

Very strong N.E. trade wind
 Broke out vinegar bread water
 & Beef. Leaking ten thousand
 strokes in twenty four hours.
 Nothing in sight. So ends this day
 Lat $11^{\circ} 26' N$
 Long $40^{\circ} 51' W$

Friday April 27th

Strong trade wind with
 frequent rain squalls
 Leaking same as usual
 So ends this day Lat $10^{\circ} 06' N$
 Long $40^{\circ} 16' N$

Sat April 28th

Strong N.E. trade wind
 Leaking same as usual.
 Nothing in sight. so ends this day
 Lat $08^{\circ} 56' N$
 Long $40^{\circ} 12' W$

Sunday April 29th

Very strong N.E. trade wind.
 Main stay parted just aft
 of the main mast
 Leaking same as usual
 Nothing in sight. So ends this
 day Lat $8^{\circ} 38' N$
 Long $39^{\circ} 57' W$

April 30th Monday

Begins with Strong N.E. trade
 winds. Repaired the main
 stay. Nothing in sight.
 So ends this day Lat $9^{\circ} 54' N$
 Long $40^{\circ} 57' W$

Tuesday May 1st

Strong N.E. trade wind
 Leaking same as usual
 Nothing in sight. So ends this day
 Lat $10^{\circ} 36' N$
 Long $41^{\circ} 11' W$

Wednesday May 2nd

Moderate N.E. trade wind.
 Broke out water. Nothing in
 sight. So ends this day
 Lat $12^{\circ} 02'$
 Long $41^{\circ} 30'$

Thursday May 3rd

Moderate N.E. trade wind
 Leaking same as usual. Nothing
 in sight. So ends this day Lat $13^{\circ} 09'$
 Long $41^{\circ} 49'$
