Remarks of a whaling voyage on board.

Wednesday June 20

At anchor at Barbadoes.
Made every thing ready for
breaking out oil. Clear
pleasant weather
So ends this day

Thursday June 21st

Broke out the oil and Coopered
it. Pleasant weather
So ends this day.

Friday June 22nd

Rainy squally weather. Oil on deck
waiting for the lighter. Starboard
watch on liberty. Port watch
breaking out water and taring down
the rigging. So ends this day

Sat June 23rd

Rainy squally weather. Port
watch ashore on liberty.
Oil still on deck. So ends this day

Sunday June 24th

At anchor at Barbadoes
George Hickson, and James
Mc Nally. Went on liberty the
23rd and have not returned
So ends this day.

Monday June 25th

At anchor at Barbadoes. Rainy
squally weather. George Hickson,
James Mc Nally and Julio Fernando,
have deserted. Oil on deck waiting
for the Steamer. So ends this day.

Tuesday June 26th

Very windy squally weather.
Oil still on deck. So ends this day

Wednesday June 27th

At anchor at Barbadoes. Very
rainy weather. At 10 o'clock P. M.
it began to blow very hard.
Tared down some of the Forward
rigging. So ends this day.

Thursday June 28th

At anchor at Barbadoes
Oil still on deck. Clear pleasant
weather. Clear Pleasant weather.
So ends this day.

Friday June 29th

At anchor at Barbadoes
A lighter came on board at
3 P. M. and took the oil.
4000 gallons. There being a
heavy swell at the time caused
the lighter to roll badly and
did some damage to the cutting
stage
