Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Monday July 9th

At anchor at Dominica All hands employed at setting up shooks. Breaking out Bread. Beef and Water and doing other jobs. Frequent rain squalls. So ends this day.

Tuesday July 10th

At anchor at Dominica All hands employed at setting up shooks and doing other jobs. So ends this day.

Wednesday July 11th

At anchor at Dominica All hands employed stowing casks for water. Staggering casks &c. So ends this day.

Thursday July 12th

At anchor at Dominica All hands employed at taking water from shore and stowing it in the hold. So ends this day.

Friday July 13th

At anchor at Dominica. Took two rafts of water from the river at Dominica. Traded Flour, Sugar, and Salt for Bananas, Potatoes, eggs, Game, Pumpkin, &c.

Sat. July 14th

At anchor at Dominica. Rained very hard all day long. Took one raft of water and broke out 3 barrels of Beef and two of Pork. So ends this day.

Sunday July 15th

At anchor at Dominica. raining. So ends this day.

Monday July 16th

At anchor at Dominica. Finished taking two hundred barrels of water and took one boat load of wood. So ends this day.

Tuesday July 17th

At anchor at Dominica. Took two large boat loads of wood. Very rainy weather. Stowed the hold. So ends this day.

Wednesday July 18th

At anchor at Dominica. Took on board Potatoes, Pumpkin, &c. Finished stowing the hold. Mr. Philip Sylvia (2nd Mate) was discharged at 11 A.M. By the U.S. Consulate at Prince Rupert, B.C. and took his chest and all his belongings on shore at 1 P.M.
