Remarks of a Whaling Voyage on board

W A Martin Master ⁸ ₁Thursday July 19th

Begins with anchor down at
Dominica. At 4 P.M. Took our
anchor and shaped our course for
sea. Passed to the leeward of
St. John. Took the Starboard anchor
to the bow and stowed away the
chain. Brig drier feet forward
and feet aft. To end this day

Friday July 20th

Clear Pleasant weather passed the
Islands of Montserrat, St. John,
and St. Christopher. At 6 P.M.
Luffed to with the lead yards
aback to the Island of Gu-
stave so ends this day

Sat July 21st

Clear Pleasant weather Wind
E.N.E. At day light commenced
to steer for St. Eustatius. Harbor
Master came on board at 9 A.M.
and took letters. No one went
on shore that belongs to the Brig.
Kept away for Sombro light
at 9.30 A.M. Passed the Islands
of St. Martin and several other
small Islands. Lighted Sombro
light at 6.30 P.M. and passed
to the windward of it. Steer-
ing N. To end this day

Sunday July 22nd

Light N.E. Trade wind. No land
in sight. To end one merchant
Brigantine. Pumps carefully attended
to. To end this day.
Lat 20° 12'
Long 63° 24'

Monday

July 23rd

Moderate wind from the eastward
Steering N.E. by N. Broke out Be-
flower to Sings. Nothing in sight. To
end this day. Lat 22° 20'
Long 63° 27'

Tuesday July 24th

Moderate wind and variable
Most of the time Heaving to E. by
Watch impeded making mate a
doing other jobs. Mate making
a new pair of fore castle steps
Segeo. Man. Jarver took his
things out of the fore castle and
put them in the storeroom and
will act a cook from this time
forward. To end a school of Hille
