Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Monday Sept - 3rd

Light - Easterly wind. Saw Black fish. Porpoise. Jumpers. Cow fish and Grampus. Saw one Bugantine. Pumped ship same as usual. So ended this day.

Long $36^{\circ}09'$ W

Tuesday Sept - 4th

Light - Easterly wind. Many jumpers in sight. Saw several Merchant-vessels. So ended this day. Broke out water

Lat - $38^{\circ}05'$ N
Long $36^{\circ}40'$ W

Wednesday Sept 5th

Light - Easterly wind. Saw one Merchant-vessel. So ended this day.

Lat - $37^{\circ}25'$ N
Long $36^{\circ}37'$ W

Thursday Sept 6th

Light - easterly wind. Saw two Steamers. Watch employed repairing main try sail. So ended this day

Friday Sept - 7th

Light - Easterly wind. Sperm Whales were raised at 12 M. by going quick N.N.E. The whales were first seen One Point on the weather bow. Lowered the Starboard and Larboard. Boats and chased them out of sight of the vessel. Come on board at dark and took in sail. Latter Part - calm so ended this day.

Long $35^{\circ}30'$ W

Sat - Sept - 8th

Began with a calm. Broke out water Beef Pork & Molasses. Latter Part a breeze came from the westward which increased to a moderate gale and shifted to the Northward. So ended this day

Long $35^{\circ}48'$

Sunday Sept - 9th

Began with a moderate gale from the Northward. Saw several jumpers and one Merchant-vessel. Latter Part - calm with a very heavy swell. So ended this day
