

Remarks of a Whaling Voyage on board

Sunday

Feb 9th

Begins with very strong (Lat $17^{\circ} 34'$ N
trade wind. Later part (Long $26^{\circ} 47'$ W
Strong and smoky. At 10 A.M.
Spermwhales were raised by
Arthur. O. Gibbons. The whaler were
going about S.W. So ends this day

Monday Feb 10th

Lowered at 1 P.M. Larb (Lat $16^{\circ} 51'$ N
ord boat went on and (Long $26^{\circ} 31'$ W
struck a large whale and brought
him along side at 5 P.M.
Antoine Joseph struck the whale.
Strong breeze. Later part commenced
cutting in at daylight. Wind blowing
quite strong from the Eastward.
Could not do any thing with the
head so commenced on the body
Cut in about two thirds of the
body when the Clip hook on the
cutting block strap broke. So ends
this day.

Tuesday Feb 11th

Begins with strong (Lat No Obs
N.E. trade wind (Long " "
Commenced trying out the body
Later part cooled down the work to
try and cut in the head. Got the
Lower jaw but could not get the
head because the sea was so rough
John Abis still off duty sick
So ends this day

Wednesday Feb 12th

Begins with very (Lat $16^{\circ} 31'$ N
strong trade winds (Long $27^{\circ} 40'$ W
Whale still laying along side
Commenced stowing down oil. Begon
trying out again

Thursday Feb 13th

Strong trade wind (Lat
Finisher trying the Long

tick. It proved to be no go d. The
Case was a total loss. So ends this
day.

Friday Feb 14th

Begins with very (Lat $6^{\circ} 23'$
strong wind from (Long $2^{\circ} 25'$ W
the all hands employed working
on the whale. Later part finished
stowing down. Did not get over
half as much oil as was expected
the whale was very poor So ends this day

Sat Feb 15th

Begins with very strong (Lat $16^{\circ} 00'$ N
wind from N.E. with (Long $22^{\circ} 30'$ W
a heavy swell. Watch em toyed
during ship's duty. Later part moderate. Saw several whales
John Abis off duty sick So ends this day

Sunday Feb 16th

Begins with Light (Lat $1^{\circ} 27'$ N
N.E. wind Later (Long $2^{\circ} 35'$ W
part the same So ends this day.

Monday Feb 17th

Begins with Light (Lat $4^{\circ} 44'$ N
N.E. winds very thick (Long $26^{\circ} 39'$ W
and smoky Cannot see over a mile
from the vessel. Later part the
same Broke out flour and
McLasser So ends this day
