

Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Wednesday March 26th

Lying at anchor at Barbadoes
Took on board 20 half barrels of beef
and ten barrels of pork. Three bbls
of Molasses three barrels of Sugar.
and ten barrels of Flour.
So ends this day.

Thursday March 27th

At anchor at ^{Barbadoes} St. Michaels.
Finished all the work and made
ready for sea So ends this day

Wednesday April 3rd

At anchor at Barbadoes. Took our
anchor at 5:30 P.M. and shaped
our course for Dominica.
Later part 10 A.M. Martinique
Bearing S. W. by S distance
about 25 miles. So ends this day

Thursday April 4th

Begins with light Easterly
wind. Later part Anchored
at Dominica.

Friday April 5th to 12th

Lying at anchor at Dominica
took One hundred and twenty
barrels of water. Repaired the Fore
topmast and shuped in the jibboom
to put new stables for the lobster
to replace the old ones that were
worn out.

Saturday April 13th

Lowered the two port boats for
a humpback. Cow. Calf and Bull
The Harbor boat went on to the calf
Antoine Joseph missed with a very
good chance

Thursday April 18th

Begins with lying at anchor at
Dominica. Legio Mannus farver
deserted.

Friday April 19th

Took our at 2 P.M. and went
about 6 miles to another bay for wood
Later part took the wood on board

Sat 20th

Took our anchor at 6 P.M. and
shaped our course for St. Eustatius.
Benjamin Lica deserted.
Later part light air from the
Eastward. Guadalupe and Mont
serrat in sight.

Sunday April 21st

Begins with very
light Easterly wind
St. Eustatius was seen at daylight
Capt Martin went on shore at 10
A.M. Brig laying off and on So ends
this day

Monday April 22

Begins with light
Easterly wind
Capt Martin came on board at 6 P.M.
And with him came two men

Later part Moderate N.E. hader
Passed Sombro at 11 P.M.

Tuesday April 23rd

Begins with Moder { Lat 18° 40' N
ate Easterly wind { Long 63° 30' W
With frequent rain squalls
Later part more pleasant
So ends this day
