

Remarks of a whaling voyage on board

Sperm whale astern {
going to the westward
At 7.30 P.m. a very heavy squall
came from the westward and
continued to blow hard all night
So ends this day

Friday May 24th

Begins with a { Lat 36 57 N
heavy norwesterly Long 71 59 W
gale. Pumps very carefully atten-
ded to every two hours. Began to
moderate about 8 P.M. Later
part a strong breeze blowing
from the N.W. Sperm whales
were raised by Manuel & B

The whales were going
very quick to windward.
continued to blow see whales
all day but did not lower

Sat May 25th

Sperm whale in sight { Lat 36 44 N
at all the afternoon Long 70 54 W
no chance to lower all going very
quick to the westward. At
about 4 P.M. wind shifted
to the S.W. Later part wind
increased to a gale. So ends this day

Sunday May 26th

Begins with a { Lat 36 44 N
moderate gale Long 70 54 W
from the S.W. Broke out water
Beef & Pork. Later part wind
a little more moderate
So ends Thursday

Monday May 27th

{ Lat 38 16
Begins with strong Long 71 16 W
S.W. wind at 7 P.M. wind shifted
to the N.E. Pumps attended to
as usual Later part wind veered
to the S.W. So ends this day

Tuesday May 28th

Begins with strong { Lat 37 48 N
S.W. wind and increased Long 72 12 W
to a heavy gale. Later part calm
So ends this day

Wed May 29th

Begins with light { Lat 37 34 N
airs from N.W. Long 73 00 W
Later part wind to the S.W.
So ends this day

Thursday May 30th

Begins with { Lat 37 11 N
light easterly Long 73 16 W
wind Later part wind veered
to the Southward and blowed very
strong Broke out bread So ends
this day

Friday May 31st

Begins with { Lat 36 36 N
strong wind from Long 74 07 W
the Southward with a very heavy
squall Later part wind increased
to a heavy gale So ends this
day

Sat June 1st

Begins with a { Lat 36 48 N
very heavy gale Long 74 19 W
from the S.E. Took all the craft
out The two port Boats
Later part gale still continues
So ends this day
