

Remarks of *A. Whiting* & voyage

Sept 14th Commenced with a heavy
W^{est} E Gail Laying with 2 anchors down
Med and later the same

Sept 15th

Commenced with strong winds from
W^{est} E and rainy weather Med & later
Part the same

Sept 16th

Commenced with moderate weather
Laying at anchor with one anchor
Med & later part fine Employed in
Ships duty

Sept 17th

Commenced with fine weather Employed
in taking on board water water
Med & later part winds S W &
Rainy so ends

Sept 18th

Commenced with rainy weather
Winds S W & blowing strong Med
& later the same

Sept 19th

Commenced as a power
Med & later the same

Sept 20th

Commenced with rainy weather
Med & later part the same

Sept 21st

Commenced with strong W^{est} W^{est}
Winds med & later the same
Employed in filling up ground tier with
salt water so ends

Sept 22nd

Commenced with fine weather med &
later the same Employed in bending
Mainsail and getting ready for sea
So ends

Sept 23rd

Commenced with fine weather at 11 A.M.
Pilot came on board hove up the anchor
Eng. crew took us in tow at 5 P.M.
Pilot let go anchor and made
all sail & stood out to sea winds
S E At 6 P.M. Cape Henry bore WSW
Distant 12 miles so ends

Sept 24th

Commenced with thick and rainy weather
Winds E S E blowing strong Breg under
short sail heading W E med part
Winds E blowing a heavy gale saw
4 Schooners & one Steamer later part
blowing very hard and bad sea on
so ends or so ends

Sept 25th

Commenced with a gale from E
Med and later part the same began
to see Port tack under storm
Stag sailer med & later part more
moderate saw 2 Steamers & Schooners
Sounded got 14 fathoms water so ends
Thursday Sept 26th

Commenced with fine weather Light W^{est} W^{est}
Winds ship under all sail steering S E
Med & later part the same

Sept by Obs 36.49 W^{est}
Long by Cor 73.56 W^{est}
