

Remarks of A Whaling voyage on Board of

Sunday Oct 6th 1889

Commenced with fine weather light W & E
Winds steering S by E under all sail
Med part fine later part Winds S W
With heavy clouds spars. Saw a
Steamer steering to the Westward so ends
Leath by ab 29.22 W
Long by Chor 71.00 W

Monday Oct 7th 1889

Commenced with squally S W winds
With thunder & lightning Med the same
Winds W S W blowing heavy later part
More moderate
Leath by ab 29.39 W
Long by Chor 70.30 W

Tuesday Oct 8th 1889

Commenced with fine weather light
S W Winds Med part light S Winds
later part fresh breeze from W
steering S
Leath by ab 29.24 W
Long by Chor 70.40 W

Wednesday Oct 9th 1889

Commenced with fine weather fresh
breeze from W steering South under
all sail for western Island for meat
Med & later the same
Leath by ab 28.00
Long by Chor 70.20

Thursday Oct 10th 1889

Commenced with strong W & E Winds
Med & later the same saw one
Bark steering to the Westward
Leath by ab 27.45 W
Long by Chor 69.58 W

Friday Oct 11th 1889

Commenced with moderate W & E breeze
steering S S W under all sail Med & later
calm with light squally squalls so ends
there 24 hours. Leath above Leath by Chor 70.19

Sat Oct 12th 1889

Commenced with light variable winds &
squally Med the same later heavy squall
so ends there 24 hours
Leath by ab 25.26 W
Long by Chor 71.34 W

Sunday Oct 13th 1889

Commenced with light weather light
W & E Winds ship heading W W Med
and later the same
Leath by ab 25.31
Long by Chor 71.52

Monday Oct 14th 1889

Commenced with light W & E winds
ship heading W W Med & later part
squally weather Winds W W so ends there
24 hours
Leath by ab 25.46 W
Long by Chor 71.34 W

Tuesday Oct 15th 1889

Commenced with a gale from W W
Med part squally later part clear
Weather blowing heavy sailing too
under storm sails

Leath by ab 26.00 W
Long by Chor 72.13 W
