Wed Oct 16th 1889
Commenced with a gale from WNW
Breg under Steam Sails heading NW
Met the same later wind WNW
Ship heading W so ends there 24 hours
Long 71.44 Lat 36.48

Thurs Oct 17th 1889
Commenced with a gale from WNW
Met the same later part fine Wind
W Lat by ab 27.44 Long by Chor 71.21

Friday Oct 18th 1889
Commenced with fresh breeze from
WNW & squally weather Ship heading
West under Short sail sailing Black.
fish Med & later part fine midball sail
Steering NW W so ends there 24 hours
Lat by ab 27.46
Long by Chor 71.55

Sat Oct 19th 1889
Commenced with fine weather Light
NW Winds Steering NW W under all
Sail employed in Meddled Steaming
Main Staysail Med & later part
fine Wind Light Lat by ab 28.51
Long by Chor 72.41

Sunday Oct 20th 1889
Commenced with fine weather Light
East Wind Steering NW W under
All sail Saw a Steamer Steering
to the West Med & later fine Saw a
Manawau Steering it to the West

Lat by ab 29.41
Long Chor 73.22

Monday Oct 21st 1889
Commenced with fine weather Light
North Wind Ship under all sail heading
NW W Med & later part calm so ends
Lat by ab 29.31
Long by Chor 74.04

Tuesday Oct 22nd 1889
Commenced with a calm, met the
same breeze in morning the
Main boat med & later part fine
Lat by ab 29.34
Long by Chor 74.31

Wed Oct 23rd 1889
Commenced with Strong Windy med
Port under Windy W later part
The same Lat by ab 30.02
Long by Chor 74.41

Thursday Oct 24th 1889
Commenced with Strong winds from
NW med & later part the same saw
3 Sails Steering to the NW later
Part more moderate wore ship to SW
Lat by ab 30.00
Long by Chor 74.52

Friday Oct 25th 1889
Commenced with Light NW Winds
Med part calm later part Light
Wind from South Wobs

Sat Oct 26th 1889
Commenced with Strong Wind from
South at 2 a.m. Raze breacher on the
Weather Beam at 12 m tack Ship to
Eastward Whaler a head toward to back
Starboard Boat went on and struck
