

Journal of the Whaling Brig Eunice
Friday 28th continued

Lat The northward Whose ship at 4 P.M. standing
33.05 At the westward At 7 P.M. whose round
Long again heading to the southward as the wind
68.48 haul into the south west The crew working
on the rigging

Saturday 29th

Lat Squally with a light rain in the morning
33.18 at 8 A.M. but clear with fine weather the
Long rest of the day. Broke out fresh water
69.33 and filled up the scuttle butt also filled
three empty cask with salt water
Wind south west

Sunday 30th

Lat This day fine weather and clear sky with the
33.12 wind same as yesterday Saw grampuses breaching
Long at 6 A.M. Whose ship at 5:30 A.M. standing to
69.29 the southward and eastward also whose round
again at 7 P.M. this ends the day

Monday May 1st 1893

Lat Light winds from the south south west
33.30 the whole day with a clear sky. Brought
Long all sail until 7 P.M. when we took in the
70.11 foretopgallant sail and gaff topsail
Stood to the westward all the day

Tuesday 2nd

Lat Fine weather and clear sky with the
33.00 wind same as yesterday Tack ship at 8 P.M.
Long standing to the southward and eastward
69.30 Crew employed working on various jobs
on the rigging. Struck a porpoise
This ends the day

Wednesday May 3rd 1893

Lat This day begins with light south westerly
33.25 winds and clear weather but shifting in to
Long the southeast at sunset with a rising barometer
71.09 At 4 P.M. passed Bark Veta steering in to the
northeast also another Barkentine steering the
same

Thursday 4th

Lat Strong southeast wind with rain until
33.22 8 P.M. when it haul into the northwest with a
Long fresh breeze and heavy swell moderating towards
71.45 sundown Saw a steamer steering in to the
northward and eastward. Broke out water
This ends the day

Friday 5th

Lat This day fine weather and clear sky
31.67 with a light northwesterly wind shifting
Long in to the southward and westward towards
71.38 sunset Repaired mainstay sail and set up
backstays

Saturday 6th

Lat Fine weather and clear sky with the
31.48 wind from the south west The crew breaking
Long out the hole for water and a few other things
71.55 At 1 P.M. lowered starboard boat and the
Captain went on board Schrs. Fred Erumsson
from New York six day out bound to Nassau

Sunday 7th

Lat Fine weather and clear sky until 2 P.M. when
31.30 it commence to rain and continued so up to
Long 5 P.M. when it cleared off Saw a schooner steering
72.02 in to the southward Whose ship at 8 P.M.
heading to the southward and eastward
