

Journal of the Whaling Brig Eunice
Monday May 8th 1893

Lat
30° 30'
Long
72° 33'

The wind died out to a calm at 2 A.M. then it came from the northward and eastward with a fresh breeze and continued so the rest of the day. Saw a schooner steering in to the westward also a barque kept off and run into the southwest from 6 A.M. until 7 P.M. when shortened sail.

Tuesday May 9th

Fresh breeze from the northeast until 2 P.M. when it hauled into the south east then became moderate. Struck two porpoises. Crew employed about the rigging. Stood to the northward all the day.

Wednesday May 10th

A strong breeze from the east north east with rain from 2 A.M. until 2 P.M. when it cleared up. Saw a steamer steering in to the northward. Run to the westward from 8 A.M. until 7 P.M. then hove too.

Thursday May 11th

The wind and ^{weather} continued same as yesterday. Saw two steamers steering in to the northward. The crew employed breaking out for water and other small jobs.

Friday May 12th

Strong wind with a few rain squalls in the morning then clear weather the balance of the day with the wind from the northeast when at 4 P.M. it shifted into the northwest and commenced to moderate. Run into the westward from 8 A.M. until 7 P.M. then hove too.

Fine weather with the wind from the northwest until 11 A.M. when it became cloudy and commenced to rain at 1 P.M. and continued squally until 4 P.M. when the wind shifted in to the southwest and the weather became clear again.

Sunday 14th

This day fresh southwest wind with a thick haze moderating towards sunset. Kept off and run to the northward from 7 A.M. until 3 P.M. then hauled up into the westward. Saw two barques steering in to the eastward.

Monday 15th

Light wind from the southwest and foggy. Run in to the northwest until 11 A.M. when the mate raised a large whale going in to the northeast. Lowered the boats but lost the run of him in the fog. Saw him again at 2 P.M. went he went down and and did not see him again.

Tuesday 16th

A fresh gale from the southwest with rain squalls up to 4 P.M. when it cleared up but with the same force of wind and a very low barometer. Saw a schooner steering in to the northwest looked like a whale. Stood to the eastward all night and to the westward all day.

A light wind with rain from the eastward until 11 A.M. when it shifted in to the
